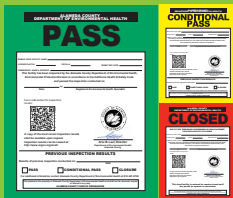


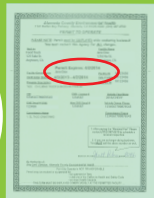
# 7 Tips for Eating on a Food Truck

## Green Placard



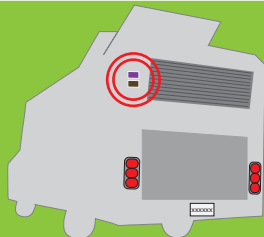
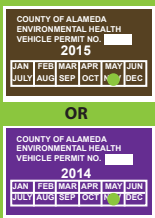
- ➔ The Placard (Green, Yellow or Red) should be posted in the service window, starting April, 2014

## Current Permit



- ➔ Does the truck have an olive-green permit posted in the window?
- ➔ Permit Expiration Date is in large letters

## Decal



- ➔ Current decal sticker is on the back (left side)
- ➔ Decal color changes every year ; month of permit expiration is punched out

## Look/Listen for Electricity



- ➔ The truck must be powered by electricity in order to keep food cold
- ➔ You should hear a generator OR see a power cord plugged into the truck



## Employee Hygiene



- ➔ Are employees washing their hands frequently?
- ➔ Are they wearing hair nets, gloves?
- ➔ Does it smell good?
- ➔ Does it look good?
- ➔ Then enjoy!

## Food Temperature



- ➔ Hot food should be HOT, not lukewarm!
- ➔ Cold food should be COLD

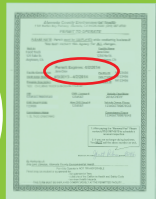
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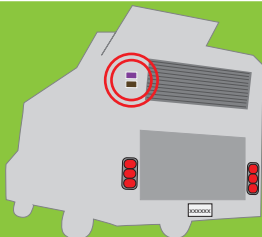
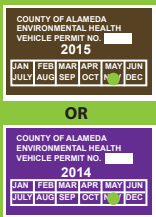
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# Please report all suspected food borne illnesses.

Our job at the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health is to keep you safe from food borne illnesses. We do this by inspecting food establishments as often as we can. It is therefore very helpful for us to be notified when people suspect they may have contracted a foodborne illness from a food establishment.
